Cindy Franks Aussie Captain earned his AXJ title at Harriman with a score of 100, a 1st placement and a time of 32:58.

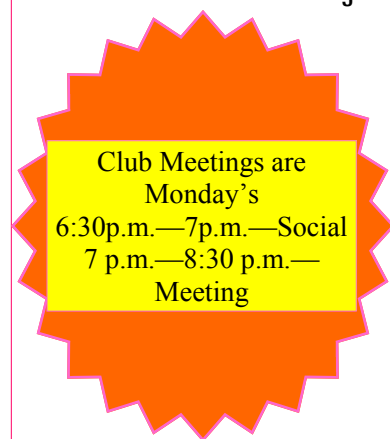

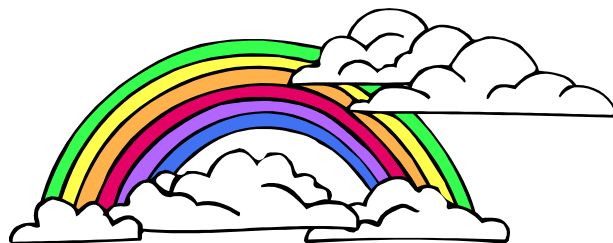
